### 2026 AFS Fellows (FAFS)

The Fellow designation recognizes members who demonstrate sustained excellence, leadership, and a strong commitment to advancing multidisciplinary collaboration in foregut care. Advancement to Fellow status acknowledges professional achievement and dedication to improving care for patients with foregut disorders, with Fellows serving as ambassadors for the Society and leaders within the field.

Applicants should have at least five years of clinical or academic practice following training, maintain specialty certification and licensure, and show meaningful engagement with AFS through meetings, leadership, education, service, or research. A one-time \$100 application fee applies, and applicants must be active members in good standing.

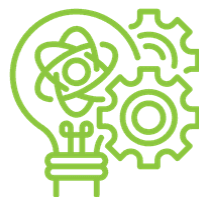


## **AFS Research Grant**

The AFS Research Grant supports innovative work focused on the diagnosis and treatment of foregut disease. Open to principal investigators who are current AFS members, the program gives preference to early-career investigators within five years of completing training. The grant is intended to stimulate original bench, clinical, or educational research and help generate momentum toward future extramural funding. Proposals are reviewed competitively by the AFS Research Committee.

Awards of up to \$10,000 are provided for a one-year period and made to the recipient's institution.

## **Motility and pH Testing Equipment Grant**

The American Foregut Society, in collaboration with Laborie, is pleased to continue the Motility and pH Testing Equipment Grant, an initiative designed to expand access to

advanced diagnostic technology and support the development of multidisciplinary foregut programs. Up to three selected sites will receive a compact motility system and an alphaOne wireless pH receiver.

Participating institutions commit to building the clinical infrastructure needed to support testing, including trained personnel, equipment supplies, and collaboration between GI and surgical teams. In addition to equipment and training provided by Laborie, AFS will offer mentorship throughout the two-year grant period to support implementation, interpretation, and program growth.

Eligible applicants must be AFS members in good standing and demonstrate a clear plan to expand foregut diagnostic services, including data participation in the AFS Quality Improvement Project. Preference will be given to programs that show strong GI-surgeon collaboration and do not currently have access to reflux or manometry testing.

## Fellowship Program Application Deadline is July 10

Applications are still open for the [2026 AFS Foregut Fellows Accelerated Program](#), taking place September 23–24 immediately before the AFS Annual Meeting.

Designed for surgical and gastroenterology fellows, this newly expanded program offers a focused, small-group learning experience featuring hands-on workshops, case-based discussions, procedure demonstrations, and expert instruction in esophageal physiology testing, reflux evaluation, and gastroparesis management.

Selected participants will receive program registration, two nights of hotel accommodations, airfare reimbursement (up to \$750), and function meals.

**Applications are due by July 10, 2026.** We encourage interested fellows to apply early for this unique opportunity to learn from leading experts and connect with peers before the Annual Meeting.
